## VENUE

The meeting will be held on October 20, 2017 from 9:30 am to 5:30 pm in the Aula Magna “Pietro Manodori” of the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia, Palazzo Dossetti, Via Allegri 9, Reggio Emilia, Italy. The University of Modena and Reggio Emilia, founded in 1175, is one of the oldest universities in the world. Reggio Emilia, founded by the Romans as *Regium Lepidi*, is known as the ‘City of the Tricolore’, since the Italian flag was there adopted on January 7, 1797. The city exports worldwide its famous foods (such as the Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese) and the Lambrusco wine, and it has famous monuments (such as Basilica della Ghiara, Duomo, Chiesa di San Prospero, Teatro Municipale). Beside its international fashion and mechanical companies and its famous kindergartens, the city hosts a futuristic architectural complex, creation of the architect Santiago Calatrava, composed by the railway Station “Mediopadana” and three arching bridges.
